Awards to Pomona and Subordinate Granges who completed programs in the star categories will be awarded at State Session during Friday evening's gala.

Star Awards will be presented only based on the information supplied in this report. The Outstanding Grange Star Report will be recognized at the gala, along with the awards given to each Grange that submits a report and earns any of the stars available. Granges completing all of the categories will earn recognition as a Star Achievement Grange.

Outstanding Subordinate and Pomona Lecturer will be awarded as well as the Outstanding Program of the Year. Both of these awards will be recognized from information on this form.

The awards for Community Service activities will also be based on information from the Star Report. The winning Grange's Combined Star Report will be sent to the National Grange convention for consideration to be awarded at the National level. The completed Community Service Additional Information Report form is required – to contain summary information only – in order to be the Colorado State Grange entry to the National Community Service contest.

Submission of Star Reports by Email (use email above) is strongly preferred. Your State Lecturer will forward emailed reports to the Directors of Community Service and Membership. If email is absolutely impossible, please mail three printed copies of your report. In addition to mailing your report to the Lecturer - please mail separate copies of your report to the Community Service and Membership Directors:

Elizabeth, Lisa, and Dominick will each need a copy of your reports by September 1, so there is time for them to thoroughly evaluate them all and prepare the prizes.

ONE BOOK

We encourage each Grange to still do a One Book or Scrapbook as this is an historical record of your Grange and is a useful informational tool to use in recruitment or just to show who and what your Grange is, and what you do.

Please send your One Book with your Grange's delegates to State Session. It will NOT be used for judging the Star categories, or Community Service or Membership activities. If no one from your Grange will be attending State Session in September, you may mail your One Book to either Director (Elizabeth or Lisa) by September 15th to allow time for it to arrive so the Director can carry it to State Session for you – your books will be judged at State Session and on view for the membership in attendance. The Outstanding One Book Award winner's book will travel to National Convention in November and then be returned to you. *This Award is separate from the Lecturer's Star and Community Service Awards.*

Granges do not need to create a One Book to be eligible for the Lecturer's Star, Community Service, or Membership Awards.

Lecturer Star Awards

Often our programs fit into more than one category. Duplication is not necessary for the lecturer report. I suggest that you explain the program or event in the star category of this report where it fits best, and then mention the other colors of star categories that may fit as well (*example: If your event fits best in the gold star, but also works for the green star, put information in the gold star and refer to the green star. Under the green star just put the name of the program and say “refer to gold star”*). You may add additional pages as necessary. The reports must be filled out completely to qualify for the awards. You may include samples of your work along with the report, such as a picture, flyer, etc. Please include *only* up to four samples per Star. If completing your report on a computer, please insert images in with the story you’re telling in that section of your report when you can. The State Grange would love to share your successes with other Lecturers; please give as many descriptive details as possible.

If your Grange has done something for the Food Sustainability Program, *and* it is also a good fit in one of the Star sections, please put your details and samples as an item under that Star and include which category / subcategory of the Food Sustainability Program applies. You can use only the Food Sustainability Program report form for those projects, if you choose. Please do not report the same event or project in both places.

Award judging will be done on the content, organization, and completeness of your Star Reports. There will be one overall Best Grange, as well as Lecturer’s awards for other categories.

Gold Star - Information

Purple Star - Publicity

Working with three or more media types qualifies for this award. Personal outreach to other groups with presentations about your Grange's activities in your community would also be considered.
